#### C. Purpose & Policy

This Language Access Plan has been prepared to address Decatur County responsibilities as a recipient of federal financial assistance from Georgia Department of Community Affairs programs and grants funded by HUD as they relate to the needs of individuals with limited English language skills.

The plan has been prepared to ensure compliance with HUD's guidance and Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, and its implementing regulations. Under HUD's guidance, Decatur County must take reasonable steps to ensure meaningful access to their programs and activities by persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP).

Executive Order 13166, titled *Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency*, indicates that differing treatment based upon a person's inability to speak, read, write or understand English is a type of national origin discrimination. It directs each agency to publish guidance for its respective recipients clarifying their obligation to ensure that such discrimination does not take place. This order applies to all state and local agencies which receive federal funds, including Decatur County.

Decatur County has developed this Language Access Plan to help identify reasonable steps for providing language assistance to persons with Limited English Proficiency (LEP) who

wish to access services provided through programs funded by the Georgia Department of Community Affairs/HUD. As defined by Executive Order 13166, LEP persons are those who do not speak English as their primary language and have limited ability to read, speak, write or understand English. This plan outlines how to identify a person who may need language assistance, the ways in which assistance may be provided, staff training that may be required, and how to notify LEP persons that assistance is available.

To prepare this plan, Decatur County used HUD's four-factor LEP analysis which considers the following factors:

- 1. The number or proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by the Community Development programs;
- 2. The frequency with which LEP persons come in contact with Community Development programs;
- 3. The nature and importance of the Community Development programs and services provided by Decatur County to the LEP population;
- 4. The resources available to Decatur County and overall cost to provide LEP assistance.

#### D. Safe Harbor Thresholds

The size of the language group determines the recommended provision for written language assistance. The Safe Harbor threshold guidelines are as follows:

Size of Language Group	Recommended Provision of Written Language Assistance
1,000 or more in the eligible population	Translate vital documents
More than 5% of the eligible population or beneficiaries and more than 50 in number	Translate vital documents
More than 5% of the eligible population or beneficiaries and 50 or less in number	Translate written notice of right to receive free oral interpretation of documents
5% or fewer of the eligible population or beneficiaries and less than 1,000 in number	No written translation is required

In accordance with HUD Safe Harbors for LEP, Decatur County will translate written Community Development documents for groups that are at least 5% of the eligible population (and more than 50 persons) or 1,000 persons, whichever is fewer. If there are fewer than 50 persons in a language group that reaches the 5% trigger above, Decatur County will not translate the vital Community Development written materials, but will provide written notice in the primary language of the LEP group of the right to receive competent oral interpretation of those written materials, free of cost.

#### II. MEANINGFUL ACCESS: FOUR-FACTOR ANALYSIS

#### A. Factor 1

The number or proportion of LEP persons eligible to be served or likely to be encountered by the programs.

Decatur County staff reviewed the most currently available census information from the U.S. Census Bureau (sourced from the ACS 2023 Table S1601) and determined that of the population of 27,157 persons over 5 years of age, 1,706 persons in Decatur County (6.3% of the total population) speak a language other than English. Of those 1,706 persons, 745 (2.74% of the total population and 43.7% of the population speaking a language other than English) have limited English proficiency; that is, they speak English less than "very well." In Decatur County, of those persons with limited English proficiency, 708 speak Spanish (2.61%), 36 speak other Indo-European languages (0.13%), 1 speaks Asian and Pacific Islander languages (0.003%), and no persons speak a language not identified in the Survey. At the present time, GA DCA has identified no Census Tracts in Decatur County that meet LEP criteria.

A review of the residents that are in the FY 24 CDBG Target Area revealed that 5 residents indicated they are Spanish speakers with limited English proficiency. These 5 persons also identified as being of Hispanic origin. The survey does not indicate the age of the individuals. There are Asian, Pacific Islander or Indo-European origin persons identified as residing in the Target Area.

The 5 persons with limited English proficiency in the Target Area represents 7.7% of the Target Area's population which meets the threshold described above for translating written notice of right to receive free oral interpretation of documents.

A summary of the population and language spoken is as follows:

#### B. Factor 2

The frequency with which LEP persons come in contact with Community Development services.

Decatur County Administrative Staff reviewed the frequency with which staff have, or could have, contact with LEP persons. This includes documenting phone inquiries or office visits, as well as public hearings and interactions during surveys. Over the past two years, there have been no requests for interpreters and no requests for translated program documents.

A review of the residents that are in the FY 2024(24p-y-043-1-6397) CDBG Target Area revealed there are persons residing in the area who speak languages other than English.

Frequency of Interaction: Annually

#### For Project Applications & Awards:

- 1. When notifying the public about the potential grant and activities
- 2. When surveying income in the target area
- 3. When notifying the public about the grant award closeout and accomplishments

#### C. Factor 3

The nature and importance of programs, activities or services provided by Community Development to the LEP population.

The 2024 CDBG project proposes street paving and drainage improvements in Kelly Crossing Subdivision. Surveys of the Target Area's residents indicate that 7.7% of the population are LEP.

Importance of the Program(s): Denial or delay of access to services or information would not have serious or life-threatening implications for any LEP individual.

#### D. Factor 4

The resources available to Decatur County, and overall cost to provide LEP assistance.

Decatur County reviewed its available resources that could be used for providing LEP assistance, including which documents would be most valuable to be translated if the need should arise. An "I Speak" card/poster will be made available to determine needed language translations. A notice (see below) will be posted in all ads for GA DCA/HUD programs regarding who to contact should language assistance be needed. Language translation, if needed, would be provided through the available bi-lingual staff and/or the Language Line for which Decatur County would pay a fee.

#### III. LANGUAGE ASSISTANCE

A person who does not speak English as their primary language and who has a limited ability to read, write, speak or understand English may be a Limited English Proficient person and may be entitled to language assistance with respect to Community Development services. Language assistance can include interpretation, which means oral or spoken transfer of a message from one language into another language and/or translation, which means the written transfer of a message from one language into another language.

#### B. LEP Identification

How Decatur County may identify an LEP person who needs language assistance:

- Post notice of LEP Plan and the availability of interpretation services free of charge in languages LEP persons would understand;
- Add statement (see below) to public meeting and event notices concerning GA DCA/HUD programs;
- All staff involved with Community Development activities will be informally surveyed periodically on their experience concerning any contacts with LEP persons during the previous year; and
- When Decatur County conducts a Public Hearing, an informational meeting or event, a staff person may greet participants as they arrive. By informally engaging participants in conversation it is possible to gauge each attendee's ability to speak and understand English. Although translation may not be able to be provided at the event (unless previously requested) it will help identify the need for future events; and
- Language Identification Cards/Posters will be used as necessary to determine a client's language needs.

#### C. Language Assistance Measures

Although there is a small percentage in Decatur County of eligible LEP households, that is, persons who speak English "not well" or "not at all", it will strive to offer the following measures:

- 1. The County Administration will take reasonable steps to provide the opportunity for meaningful access to LEP clients who have difficulty communicating English.
- 2. The following resources will be available to accommodate LEP persons:
  - Interpreters if available will be provided within a reasonable time period; or
  - Language interpretation will be accessed through Language Line Solutions.
- 3. Language Identification Cards/Posters will be used as necessary to determine a client's language needs.
- 4. The following statements will be added to public meeting and event notices concerning GA DCA/HUD programs:

"Persons with special needs relating to handicapped accessibility or foreign language should contact Alan Thomas, County Administrator at 229-248-3030 before \_\_\_\_\_\_. This person can be located at offices of the Decatur County Board of Commissioners, 203 W. Broughton Street and is available between the hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, except holidays, or you may call 229-248-3030. Persons with hearing disabilities may consider using the Georgia Relay Service, at (TDD) 1-800-255-0056 or (Voice) 1-800-255-0135."

#### IV. STAFF TRAINING

The following training will be provided to all Community Development staff:

- Information on the Title VI Policy and LEP responsibilities;
- Description of language assistance services offered to the public;
- Documentation of language assistance requests; and
- How to handle a potential Title VI/LEP complaint.

All contractors, subcontractors and sub-recipients performing work for or receiving federal funds for Community Development projects will be required to follow the Title VI/LEP guidelines.

#### VI. TRANSLATION OF DOCUMENTS

A vital document is any document that is critical for ensuring meaningful access to Decatur County's major activities and programs by beneficiaries generally and LEP persons specifically. Leases, rental agreements and other housing documents of a legal nature enforceable in U.S. courts should be in English.

Because more than 5% of the beneficiaries within the County FY 2024 CDBG project are Limited English Proficient (LEP) Spanish speakers, Decatur County will provide a written notice of a right to receive free oral interpretation of vital documents, translated in Spanish. The following list identifies those vital documents that will be translated, if requested:

- Public Notices
- Residential Utility Service Applications
- Fair Housing & Non-Discrimination Information
- · CDBG Household Surveys; and,
- Applications for Assistance

#### VII. MONITORING AND UPDATING THE LAP PLAN

Decatur County will update the LAP Plan as required. At a minimum, the plan will be reviewed and updated every five years using data.census.gov for census information, or when it is clear that higher concentrations of LEP individuals are present in Decatur County. Updates will include the following:

- The number of documented LEP person contacts encountered annually;
- How the needs of LEP persons have been addressed;
- Determination of the current LEP population in the service area;
- Determination as to whether the need for translation services has changed;
- Determine whether local language assistance programs have been effective and sufficient to meet the need;
- Determine whether Decatur County financial resources are sufficient to fund language assistance resources needed;
- Determine whether Decatur County fully complies with the goals of this LAP Plan; and
- Determine whether complaints have been received concerning the County's failure to meet the needs of LEP individuals.

#### VIII. DISSEMINATION OF THE DECATUR COUNTY LAP PLAN

The LAP Plan will be on the Decatur County website page and provided to anyone requesting the information.

### IX. RECORDS

Decatur County will maintain records in the office of the County Clerk regarding its efforts to comply with Title VI LEP obligations. These records will be reviewed periodically and open to the public in an effort to improve service.

#### X. COMPLAINTS/FINDINGS

Any person who believes they have been denied the benefits of this LAP or that Decatur County has not complied with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 42 U.S.C. 2000(d) and Executive Order 13166 regulations may file a complaint with the County LAP Coordinator. The County LAP Coordinator may be the first point of contact for any complaints or appeals, but the DCA LAP Coordinator must be informed of all complaints and appeals. The LAP Coordinator will provide oversight of the complaint/appeal resolution process. To file a complaint, submit the written complaint to:


